

Meeting webcasts

Protocols for filming

The default shot will be on the chair or a wide-angle shot of the meeting room.

Cameras will cover a member who is addressing the meeting. Cameras will also cover other key participants in a meeting, including staff when giving advice and members of the public addressing the meeting during the public input time.

Generally interjections from other members or the public are not covered. But if the chair engages with the interjector, the interjector's reaction can be filmed.

Powerpoint presentations, recording of votes by division and other matters displayed by overhead projector may be shown.

Shots unrelated to the proceedings, or not in the public interest, are not permitted.

If there is general disorder or a disturbance from the public gallery, coverage will revert to the chair.
