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Current Mangrove Policy

Recent plan change (Coastal Plan - March 2011).

- Comprehensive evidence base: Value = 'case-specific'
- 'Most liberal' policy and rule framework.
- Policy recognises mangrove pros & cons
 - +ve:- ecological, hazard mitigation
 - -ve:- amenity, recreation, navigation, wading birds, infrastructure & drainage
- Signif. management best as part of integrated plan
- Provides guidance where management is and isn't appropriate
- Expanded PAs, new seedling removal PA.
- Wading bird provisions (PA seedlings, CA adult)
- Still need consent (RDA) for most adult clearance
- Removed Prohibited A. (to DA/NCA)

•2011 - Mangrove Management Options report

 Promoted existing reg. framework, & proving resourcing to work within it.

•ESF, LB's, RDOC (Dec 2011) resolution:

- Retain existing RMA regulatory framework for UP
- Acknowledge LB key role, note LTP funding reqt.
- Regional assessment (time dependent).



LB feedback - initial response

- Harbour-based management plans. [Albert-Eden, Orakei]
 - Site-by-site, agreed criteria, individual consents
 - Promoted by existing framework
 - Being developed & applied in Mangere-Otahuhu (& Mangere)
- Permitted Activity [Franklin, Kaipatiki, Papakura]
 - Historically impt. (& natural) waterways, SW/flooding mngt, prev. remediation.
 - Requires site-specific assessment
 - Conditions & scale of prev. granted consents
 - Inappropriate to transfer
- Regional Consenting process [Manukau Harbour Forum, Franklin, Kaipatiki, Mangere-Otahuhu]
 - Simplified, consistent process
 - Consistency available, no one-size-fits-all solution



LB feedback - initial response

- Waterways and beaches [Kaipatiki, Manukau Harbour Forum]
 - PA Adult mangroves 5m of centre line of <u>navigable waterways</u> serving <u>public recreational beach</u>
 - Navigable waterways broad definition, possible non-target application, effects uncertain.
 - <u>Beaches:</u> room for further consideration, looks like potentially low risk, needs careful defintion (what's in, what out?).
 - Seedlings relax 'non-motorised' hand held tools.
 - Agreed
