Nature of change	Modification 108 incorrectly removed the entire Notable Tree ID 218 from Schedule 10 Notable Trees Schedule and the GIS Viewer. In the Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan Decisions Version there were three trees listed under ID 218; Hinau, English Oak, Holm Oak. Only the Holm Oak has been completely removed from this site. The other two trees (Hinua and English Oak) need to remain on the Notable Trees Schedule under ID 218. Reinstate ID 218 to the Notable Tree schedule, but remove reference to the Holm Oak, the corresponding botanical name and change the number of trees listed from three to two trees. Reinstate ID 218 at 14 Silver Road in the GIS Viewer and amend the property summary to remove reference to the Holm Oak.
Effect of change	This corrects an error made in Modification 108 which is effective from 15 September 2016. No effect will be caused by the minor error correction.
Changes required to be made	Amend GIS Viewer property summary as follows: Natural Heritage: Notable Trees Overlay – 218, Hinau, English Oak, Holm Oak Amend Schedule 10 and GIS Viewer (planning maps) as shown in the attachment below.



Nature of change	Modification 108 amended the name of Outstanding Natural Landscape (ONL) ID 83 from 'Waiheke Island Park Point Headland' to 'Waiheke Island Te Wharau Bay Coastal Ridge & Slopes' to align with an Environment Court decision. However Modification 108 did not amend the descriptions of the ONL
	Amend the ONL Schedule so the descriptions for ID 83 refer to coastal ridges and slopes rather than park point headland to align with the name.
	The extent of ONL 83 does not need amending, however the name of ID 83 will need to be corrected within the property summary shown in the GIS Viewer to align with the name in the ONL Schedule.
Effect of change	A clause 16 amendment is deemed appropriate for the following reasons:
	This corrects an error. No effect will be caused by the minor corrections to the descriptions. The correction is consistent with a decision of the Environment Court.
