



### **Background information**

The North Shore Heritage Trust, launched in November 2002, aims to encourage and support owners of places of cultural heritage significance to conserve and enhance buildings or places, and to raise public awareness and appreciation of New Zealand's heritage.

As part of its role, the Trust administers a fund established to provide one-off grants of up to \$5,000 towards the conservation of heritage places on the North Shore. In addition the Trust can provide owners with advice on conservation best practice.

Applications from all applicants will be considered on their heritage merits, urgency of work required and funds available.

As well as those heritage buildings identified for protection under the Auckland Council District Plan (North Shore City), and all properties in that district plan's Residential 3: Built Heritage zone, (which applies to most of Devonport and Birkenhead/Northcote), are eligible to apply for a grant.

The Trust meets every two months to consider new funding applications, and review progress on projects underway.
