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## Proposed Plan Change 80 Information Sheet Plan Change 80 – Changes to the Regional Policy Statement

In August and September 2022, Auckland Council is inviting submissions on changes to the Auckland Unitary Plan (AUP) – our city's planning rulebook – to allow for greater building heights and densities in urban Auckland. This is known as Proposed Plan Change 78 -Intensification.

This information sheet explains Proposed Plan Change 80 to the AUP, which seeks amendments to the AUP's Regional Policy Statement to support Proposed Plan Change 78 - Intensification.

Submissions are now invited on the proposed plan change. The period for submissions closes on 29 September 2022.

# The government's approach to well-functioning urban environments

The government's National Policy Statement on Urban Development (NPS-UD) came into force in August 2020. To deliver the NPS-UD the council is required to publicly notify changes to the AUP by 20 August 2022.

The NPS-UD directs Auckland Council to, among other things, make decisions that contribute to well-functioning urban environments.

The concept of a well-functioning urban environment as set out in Policy 1 of the NPS-UD and covers:

- enabling a variety of homes
- enabling sites for business

- ensuring good access to facilities and services by active modes and public transport
- supporting the operation of land and development markets
- reducing greenhouse gas emissions
- being resilient to effects of climate change.

The NPS-UD also introduces the concept of qualifying matters, and these are also addressed in detail in Proposed Plan Change 78 information sheet #7 and #8.

#### **Regional Policy Statement**

We reviewed the Regional Policy Statement (RPS) in the AUP to see how well it contributed to a 'well-functioning urban environment' and concluded that it did cover most of the necessary things.

The exception is the part about greenhouse gas emissions. However, we cannot address this at the moment because the council can't consider greenhouse gas emissions in the AUP until after December 2022.

The RPS does deal with the effects of climate change but not in a comprehensive and consistent way resulting in some gaps, specifically about being resilient to the effects of climate change.

In the RPS, 'qualifying matters' as a term is not specifically used but many of the values that are required to be protected by the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) are matters addressed in the AUP. This is from the RPS level through to overlays and zone rules, but some qualifying matters do not have policy guidance from the RPS.

#### **Our proposed changes**

While the RPS addresses many of the elements that contribute to a well-functioning urban environment, we considered that it was good practice to add reference to it in appropriate places in the RPS. This would be helpful as it sets out how urban areas should be developed and would help guide future plan changes to the AUP to allow the development of new areas.

We have added reference to well-functioning urban environment to policies in Chapter B2 Urban Growth of the AUP, including those relating to:

- compact urban form
- quality built environment
- residential growth and intensification
- commercial and industrial growth.

We have also made some changes and additions to the RPS to ensure we are more resilient to the effects of climate change when new development occurs. The additions include to the chapters in the AUP on:



- Urban growth and form
- Natural resources
- Coastal environment
- Environmental risk, natural hazards and climate change.

While qualifying matters are addressed in the Proposed Plan Change 78, it is also best practice to integrate the concept into the RPS and provide regional policy guidance for the district plan provisions. Therefore, policies are included within the RPS relating to qualifying matters including to the sections on:

- Residential growth
- Residential intensification
- Commercial and industrial growth.
