The local board raised the following points and questions in response to the presentation: Questioned what happens to properties that back out of the categorisation process. Staff noted they would follow up. Request staff notify property owners as decisions are being made, noting communication to date has been poor. Staff clarified Healthy Waters is compiling information to share with the impacted parties. Request staff include Totaravale and wider Wairau catchment area as part of future presentations, noting their potential impact on the Devonport-Takapuna Local Board area. Clarified that Auckland Council share of the co-funding agreement is dependant on the outcome of the Long Term Plan. Clarified there is an ongoing conversation with the planning department of Auckland Council, noting concerns about consents being granted in flood-affected areas, and request further information and guidance on this issue. Called for better coordination between Council departments, noting the immense stress for those impacted. Sought clarification of the role of the delegate to the blue-green working group. Next Steps: A memo will be circulated to the board next Tuesday, 19 December A formal resolution is required to appoint a delegate from the Local Board Local Board staff to collate any further board questions and liase with the Recovery Office.

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

Making Space for Water:


Blue-green network design approach

Devonport-Takapuna local board workshop






Categorisation Update



2180 homeowners have voluntarily opted into the categorisation process regionwide

208 homeowners have opted in from Devonport-Takapuna LB





Catchment options are being assessed

Wairau catchment remains a high priority.

Several clusters of high-risk properties likely to be category 3 across the local board area, especially Nile/Seine Road area.

Categorisation is expected in March. Buy-out will be critical for public safety.

A catchment-wide solution will be informed by categorisation.

Staff are rebuilding the model for that catchment based on known impact.

Preference for catchment-wide options to maximise investment benefit.

AF Thomas Reserve/Golf course options will be developed with Kaipatiki LB.
