Governance Capability Kura Kawana	Lee Corrick Program Lead, Elected Member Development	Keeping informed	 The local board was provided with an introduction to the Kura Kawana programme. The local board raised the following points and questions in response to the presentation: Noted that, given recent weather events, induction for elected members should include their role in emergency response. Noted that, given induction delivery for this term has been interrupted somewhat by major issues, having scheduled training sessions in the calendar has been helpful. Noted the staff member's local board experience and thanked them for their insight, particularly for new members. Clarified that training using the Individual Development Budget must be connected to the governance capability framework.

Auckland Transport - Lake Road update	Andrew Mein Manager of Strategic Projects, Central Access Caroline Coleman Senior Transport Planner	Keeping informed	 The local board was provided with an update on the Lake Road project. The local board raised the following points and questions in response to the presentation: Expressed frustration at the lack of communications regarding this project. Clarified that the schematics included in the presentation are initial design drafts and are subject to further design changes. Expressed concern at the security of funding for this project. Staff noted they were unsure given the current financial situation. Asked about the possibility of putting a bus lane and T2 lane through busy intersections along Lake Road, such as around Takapuna Grammar, noting it would be beneficial for the public to see some work beginning on this project. Noted the potential issue of raised crossings along Bayswater Avenue creating flooding hazards. Asked about the possibility of Dynamic lane(s). Staff noted they have their place and are feasible to include on Lake Road, however this would have little impact on the Esmonde Road pinchpoint. Clarified that no upgrades to alternative routes, such as Jutland Road, were currently being planned; the key focus is on Lake Road. Expressed concern that the current budget is not enugh to sufficiently improve the corridor. Clarified that there is no Plan B if this project does not go ahead Noted that slow projects erode public confidence in Auckland Council and Auckland Transport, and suggest resuming engagement talks once detrailed designs are ready. Next Steps: Letter of support from the Board, to go back to Waka Kotahi end of May

-	Local Board Plan Development	Guinness Local Board Advisor		 The local board raised the following points and questions in response to the presentation: Concern that promising continuous library service provision without distrurbance is a difficult promise to keep. Noted the need to include point about coordinating initiatives in our local board area, to avoid too many overlapping programmes. Clarified that consideration of accessibility in local board asset design was being incorporated. Noted the preference of locally sourced materials and locally based business as an additional advocacy item. Clarified that the completion of the Local Parks Management Plan is expected by the end of the current term. Noted support for way-finding signage projects, citing the Kaipatiki Explorer as a model example Noted the differences between social and local procurement, and concern for the Board's role in that space. Next Steps: The first draft of the Local Board Plan is expected to be ready for peer review by Thursday 18 May. A draft chair's message Further editing





Summary of Detailed Business Case Proposal

- New transit lanes targeting the most congested parts of Esmonde Road and Lake Road
- Upgrading the existing Lake Rd cyclelanes to be safer
- Implementing new cyclelanes on Bayswater Ave
- Safer and more efficient intersections
- New technology (such as electronic roadside signs and apps) to provide travellers with up-to-date travel information





Detailed Business Case completion

 Work on the Detailed Business Case was completed at the time of the first COVID-19 lockdown in mid-2020

- Due to pandemic-related budget constraints, further work was paused, and Auckland Transport did not seek co-funding from Waka Kotahi to commence detailed design or implementation
- The Detailed Business Case was approved by the Auckland Transport Board in late-2020,
 - it represents Auckland Transport's position on the project, but further progress cannot occur until Waka Kotahi funding is confirmed



Funding Position



- \$48m identified in 2021-31 Regional Land Transport Plan (RLTP)
- Auckland Transport is currently seeking Waka Kotahi co-funding for:
 - Pre-implementation (detailed design)
 - Implementation (construction)
- Ngā Tiriti Ngangahau: The Vibrant Streets programme from Auckland Council
 - To enable the advancement of the Bayswater Ave Cycleway
 - This funding is no longer viable
 - Bayswater remains part of the Lake Road Esmonde RoadImprovements Project
- RLTP 2024/25 2033/34



Where we left off

- . The application for WK Delegations Committee endorsement and funding approval
 - Submitted in August 2022. This included:
 - An addendum to the Detailed Business Case to further support the project with extensive responses to the questions asked before submission. The addendum included
 - a revised cost estimate accounting for price escalation
 - Operating costs associated with enforcement,
 - Revision of cycle predictions with the Northern Pathway no longer progressing.
 - Provision of additional data relating to transit lane usage
 - Vehicle Kilometers Travelled (VKT) and emission reductions.
 - Revised economic assessment



Where we are now


- Lake Road Project Application Processing
 - AT was and continues to work collaboratively with Waka Kotahi
 - Various supplementary clarifications were received, with AT responding promptly
 - Extensive discussion between AT and WK to progress the project
- AT requested written confirmation of any additional information required to process the application.
 - AT subsequently received a letter clarifying WK information requirements (April 2023)
- AT developing response

A WAKA KOTAHI

Indicative Timeframe RLTP 2024 – 2027

For the 2024–27 NLTP, RLTPs should be approved in April 2024, and we aim to adopt the NLTP by 30 June 2024.

- The main changes that you'll notice in the timeline include:
- **Draft RLTP** problem statements and 10-year priorities should be ready by **December 2022** to ensure they can influence activity management plans.
- Transport Investment Online (TIO) will be updated and ready for use by August 2023.
- Submissions of programmes in TIO are being brought forward to ensure complete RLTP long lists are available for **RLTP consultation**. These dates include:
 - **August 2023** initial submission of continuous programmes
 - **September 2023** initial submission of improvement activities (incl. LCLR)
 - **December 2023** final submission of continuous programmes & improvement activities (incl. LCLR)
- Moderation of NLTP activities is being bought forward to better align with proposed RLTP consultation dates.
 - September 2023 initial moderation of continuous programmes
 - October 2023 initial moderation of improvement activities (incl. LCLR)
 - February 2023 final moderation of continuous programmes & improvement activities (incl. LCLR)
