In the 2018 Census there were 95,670 people living in Manurewa. **12.4% of the Manurewa population is aged 60 and over.**

We have a diverse population. 36.3% Pacific peoples, 29.2% European, 26.0% Māori, 25.4% Asian, 2.1% Middle Eastern/Latin American/African.

Follow the Tōtara Puhinui Creek Path through the park and along the fringe of a tōtara forest, or the scenic Tōtara Bridle Path for a country experience.


Manurewa Shuttle Link Services

Manurewa Local Board, in partnership with the Manurewa Business Association delivers this service.

It's aimed at providing better commuting options for Manurewa locals to travel around the local board area. The purpose of the shuttle bus is to link residents to the area's two town centres - Manurewa and Clendon.

The 10-seater shuttle is free for the community and runs from Wednesday to Friday along three routes.

The service will connect the suburbs of Randwick, Clendon, Leabank, Weymouth, Wattle Downs, Wordsworth and Alfriston to the town centres providing everyone with better access across the local board area. Routes are designed to include our aged care housing units around Manurewa.



Lifelong Learning Fund

The board's Lifelong Learning Fund supports residents aged 55 and over to participate in learning opportunities and continue to contribute to the community. These grants enable study in areas as diverse as computers and information technology, religious studies, conversational te reo, korowai-making and pastoral counselling.

The Elder Abuse Response Service is a free, confidential 24 hour helpline.

If you have concerns about how you are being treated or feel frightened or at risk, help is available. It is free, and available 24 hours a day.

When you call the helpline, you will be put in touch with a trained coordinator who works in your region.

The coordinator will:

- ask for consent to assess your situation
- work with you to make sure you are safe and help you manage the risk of abuse or neglect
- identify and work with other organisations who can help and support you, including police, health providers, lawyers, banks and government agencies.

If you are concerned about elder abuse, whether you are an older person yourself, a family member, friend, neighbour or professional, you can contact our Elder Abuse Response Service for free and confidential advice.
