MOUNT ROSKILL-SHINAGAWA JOINT COMMUNIQUE ON FUTURE EXCHANGES

April 21, 1989 Shinagawa, Tokyo, Japan

The Boroughs of Mount Roskill and Shinagawa, assisted by the Shinagawa-ku International Civil Friendship Association, are delighted to announce the agreement on future exchanges that will be actively carried out to develop goodwill and friendship between our respective communities.

With this communique we would like to indicate several specific programs that will occur this year and in the future. Specifically:

- 1. Accepting the invitation by Mayor David J. Hay of Mount Roskill, Mayor Kyuji Takahashi of Shinagawa will visit the Borough of Mount Roskill to establish the official friendly relations between the two Boroughs in 1989.
- ★ 2. Youth Homestay Exchange Visit will start in 1990 as follows:
 - (1) Way

A delegation from each Borough will visit their partner community one after the other every two years: that is; one from Shinagawa will visit Mount Roskill in 1990, and the other from Mount Roskill will visit Shinagawa in 1991.

The exchanges will occur in the same way beyond 1991.

- (2) Ages 14~18
- (3) Number of Delegates Youth: 10 Chaperon: 2 Total: 12
- (5) Season

Delegation from Shinagawa visits in mid August to early September.

Delegation from Mount Roskill visits in mid March to end May.

- 3. Sch∞ls in Mount Roskill and Shinagawa will make Educational Exchanges in the way as follows:
 - (1) Establish sister school relationship.
 - (2) Exchange letters and exhibits continually between sister schools, and classrooms.

Many other programs have also been discussed. The following forms the basis of future exchange programs:

- (1) Sports Exchanges
- (2) Cultural Exchanges on awide range of traditional arts and others
- x (3) Exchanges of borough officials and citizens

The Boroughs of Mount Roskill and Shinagawa hope to promote the warmth and understanding of our two communities, which have developed during the visit of Mount Roskill Delegation, through the exchange programs that will be carried out.
