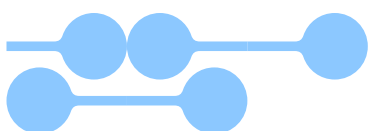

These outcomes have shaped the priorities within this Local Board Plan and are reflected throughout the five focus areas.



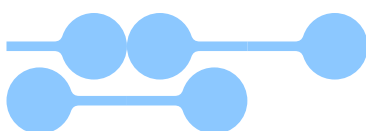
## Te hāpori **Community**

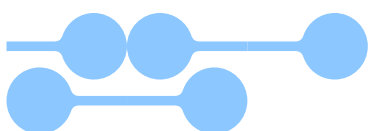
# Built environment

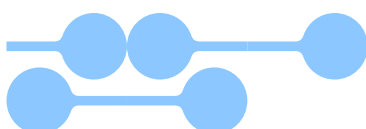
## **Transport**
