SLOW RACES NOWHERE LOLANI DALOSA

In Slow Races Nowhere, Lolani Dalosa examines identity in Aotearoa, using racehorses and cows to focus on the absurd nature of choice.

Through the use of cut-out displays, silhouettes and video, Lolani utilises an assortment of stock images which he then repurposes into narrative driven-installations. Dalosa duplicates, warps, digitally manipulates and slices recognisable iconography; the images undergo cyclical

processes that echo the visual properties of current online media. These gestures highlight ideas of repetitive behaviours, cycles and everyday addictions. This body of works offers up an unconventional view on Pacific life.

A GATHERING SUTURE COLLECTIVE

This body of work from Suture Collective brings together new pieces from five artists based across the motu. Referencing a coming together of practices and locations, A Gathering also pays tribute to moments across time, in which the Nathan Homestead garden, and the neighbouring Botanic Gardens have provided gentle (genteel) settings for tea parties, picnics, celebrations and community events.

The word 'gathering' can also be treated as a a verb, whether it be gathering flowers and produce, or in this grouping, gathering ideas, marks and artworks, sweeping them toward one another, to form a new dynamic.

Auckland Felters is a collective of contemporary felt makers from all over the Auckland region. We are bonded through our shared love of turning fluffy wool fibres into works of art, durable fabrics and even sculptures.

SMALL ACTS OF TENDING HELEN HARVEY

_

Can small actions make a difference? Small Acts of Tending is a diaristic installation, which asks this question. Daily tending activities, picking up rubbish and weeding, are represented by sculptural strings of painted strata and whiri pāraharaha (plaited cords).

Together, they form a visual record of care. A palette of earth and mineral pigments codifies complex material relationships connecting communities and te taiao (the natural world). Immersive and meditative, the work demonstrates how small, repeated actions can make a meaningful difference for te taiao and biodiversity.

BLOOMINGS SHERRILL BENTLEY

Sherrill Bentley's art celebrates the vibrant beauty of Aotearoa, inspired by gardens, beaches, and native birds. Her own garden, alive with blooming flowers and the calls of Tui and Kingfishers, is her sanctuary and creative spark. Painting is her meditation, translating nature's energy into vivid colour on canvas.

Senior Tuesdays, art club for kids on a Thursday and a drop-in makerspace on Saturdays is what you can expect coming soon to the homestead.



A BRIEF HISTORY

The family firm of L.D. Nathan and Co. was started at Kororāreka in the Bay of Islands in 1840 by David Nathan, having left England to settle in the Antipodes. In 1841 he moved to Auckland where he married and developed a successful trading and textile business. The Nathan family have been highly influential in the establishment of New Zealand's Jewish community and many public services we enjoy today.

In 1910, David Nathan and his wife Simone built their summer residence in Manurewa and named the property 'The Hill'. The original wooden villa was destroyed by fire in 1923 and a new permanent residence was rebuilt on the same site in 1925. It included a large estate with a working farm, extensive rose gardens, native bush, ponds and a Norman style water tower, an iconic feature of Manurewa.


In 1964, with the development of the Southern Motorway, the estate was sold to accommodate residential growth in South Auckland. The land around the Nathan home was developed as the Hillpark subdivision, while David Nathan Park and Homestead were held as public assets at the request of the Nathan family. The Nathan House was transformed to accommodate the mayor's office and additional buildings were brought on-site for staff and visitor services. In 1978 Nathan Homestead was handed back to the community as a council-run arts and culture centre.

In 2015 major renovation work commenced to improve the services and unique heritage features of the site, to ensure the centre was able to support the growing needs of our community. In 2017, Te Ākitai Waiohua gifted the name Pukepuke (hilly) to David Nathan Park and Homestead, referring to their ancestor, Īhaka Takanini's description of his land when it was sold to the Crown in 1842, a block that included the David Nathan Park. This name further acknowledges 'The Hill', a name affectionately used by the Nathan family for their home in Manurewa, and recognises the contributions of mana whenua and the Nathan family.


