# RECYCLING MADE EASY

You can recycle grocery packaging containers made of plastics 1, 2, or 5, glass, metal and cardboard. Simply empty and rinse all your containers and place them loose in your recycling bin, together with flattened paper and cardboard from your home.

- No soft plastics (e.g. plastic bags and wrapping)
  they get caught in the sorting machines.
  You can drop these off at collection points at local participating retailers.
- No batteries, gas bottles, appliances, or vape devices in your recycling or rubbish bin – they can cause fires.

Check before you throw at aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/whereitgoes

#### Please note:

- All recyclable packaging/containers must be wider than 5cm at the widest point and smaller than 4 litres in capacity.
   All flat paper and cardboard items must be larger than 10cm x 14cm.
- Empty and rinse all recyclable items and place loose in your recycling bin.
- Put all lids in your rubbish bin.
