• Scott you mentioned advocating for a pedestrian crossing on Melanesia Rd, I work on Morrin Rd in St Johns, seemingly without consultation but maybe it happened many years ago, a substantial cycleway has been put immediately adjacent to the park where people park to use buildings, immediately across the road there is a big sports park (CMP) that is heavily used. Now people who depend on roadside parking have to cross the road when they didn't use to. The safety of crossing this road is a big problem for workers, my workplace is talking to AT to advocate for a safer crossing for staff to cross from 1 side where there are carparks to get safely to work





- Thanks to board for work at Tahuna Torea, people love pathways there, one of the challenges is the amount of resources we have to look after Tahuna Torea, similarly to how OLB is struggling with resources and keep asking for staff to do more. Tahuna Torea relies on volunteers who are harder to come by and are getting older, volunteers struggle to keep on top of weeds, pests, trapping. Could go on a recruitment drive in neighbourhood but they don't have resources for that, could Council or OLB help out with a recruitment drive for this, is this something the board could help lead?
- Scott you mentioned one of the goals for next year is to make more use of Tagalad, I'm from the tennis club across the road, interested in making it a multi-sport facility, particularly with padel tennis taking off recently, are there any plans for this?
- o Doesn't know if appropriate for Annual Plan, but it looks like there are a few things that are in the 'too hard basket'. Maybe if LB has appetite for it, to take on the challenge of finally resolving problem of the silo of boat ramps on beaches at Kohi and Mission Bay. Need more enforcement here for parking on boat ramps.
- Thanks to Council for massive improvement in Churchill Park, pines have come down, mountains of mulch which will be spread, restoration plantings of gulleys, community has waited a long time for this so they are pleased with the work.
- Is there any thought of getting some local artists to decorate the implacements (?) rather than having them graffitied, children's artworks doesn't tend to get vandalised so is there plans to use local artists along the waterfront that explains the story of the city etc?
