Speeders at locals coming home from work – 4-6pm is worst time, people coming home from work. Local facebook is vicious if anyone says anything about speeding.....sense of entitlement to go 100km. Is there any on roads things like double lines that could to easily implemented?			1
Speed limit changes dont seem like common sense - means the public looses trust and confidence in AT/Council.			1
Orere Point on septic tanks and winter we can smell sewerage in stormwaters often and lots. No stormwater (very minimal). Open culverts and some kerb and channel, no maintenance of what little stormwater we've got (blocks extremely quickly). All drains to the creek/beach. Lower down properties are being flooded by overland stormwater which floods their septic systems. A lot of people aware of it, but nothing be done, not listening to local knowledge, not feeding back to community, never hear back. Roadside drains could easily be maintained by community, but not allowed to, moaning about traffic management. Trees overhang the road, bus has to go on other side, community could maintain trees. Would like communities to manage stuff locally, DIY for maintenance, suggest community liasion, administrator person who can liaise with council staff, tell them whats happening, then get on with it. "community led". Could even be community funded. Trees overgrown at clinic and library building at Orere Clinic (leased building). Part of the library, in the town, opposite shops. Perfect thing for community to do the maintenance, trim the trees back, clean the windows. But council gets in the way, not allowed to trim the trees. Dont pay rent currently. Council could reduce costs by letting community do the maintenance.

Graemes Beach Settlers meeting 13 July 2023

Attendees: 14 people

Council: Sharlene, Amanda K, Lucy

Hall does not have access to broadband, would like to have – Starlink? Reason for security cameras – someone has to come out from Pukekohe to look after, with internet access could review footage etc from elsewhere/access server.

Jane Cain – new rules and regulations?

Constitution – keep existing and only make amendments (retain info about original people involved from 1938).

Have ideas to get a few more things for emergency preparedness eg mattresses, generator, defribillator. Will need to raise funds for this.

Contract with Civic 2017-2020, not renewed, can rely on this being renewed?

Big Bay and east end upgrade – toilet block being renewed

All toilet blocks renewals seem to be in limbo – Matakawau and Wattle Bay also. 2

\$1200 month for cleaning of toilets, pay out \$600 to do it....would like to know, discreet enquiries.

Ramp end of big bay, toilets, silting up goes into the toilet floor, takes a lot of water to get it clean, last two weekends farmer has cut water off, water coming through is black, his work caused silt to bank up behind toilets, silt is coming through back of the toilet block. Is being flooded by drain by driveway, sump down. Water needs to be redirected.

Possibility of moving the west end toilet.

Still getting water from farmer and camp ground for toilet blocks. Toilet blocks are half on farmers land.

Design for west end seawall. Has it been formally adopted? To share with Doug/Murray.

Rubbish bin close to the beach (people picking up plastic), wanting closer to the beach by picnic tables.

Concerned about ramp proposed for Big Bay, creek undercut ramp – request to share final plans

What's in the plan for elderley?

Graemes Beach – a lot of people christmas/new year, it would be a good idea if you bought bigger bins over christmas. More capacity, 10-12 days summer. Bring a temporary skip bin.

Pests - Pine trees on side of road they are a pest, left to grow big, would like locals to be able to get rid of these

Would like community to be able to do things eg gravel on roads – use local businesses, but also allow locals to fix things themselves

Concerned about how much things cost for councils eg Big Bay seawall costing \$1.34 million.

Cleaning of roadside drains needs to be more regular – back to what it was like in Franklin, grading and cleaning culverts.

Bus service once or twice a day commuter service from Awhitu – access for older people to public hospitals?

Concern about what happens if the road fails and no access, no wharfs either

Cycle signs on Awhitu Rd – for existing user group 15 or so with e-bikes – want people to be made aware that there are bicycles on the road.

Would prefer off-road trails, too dangerous with all the trucks

Matakawau pine plantation – co-ordinate with Awhitu Landcare. Is there appetite for group to manage planting/weeds? would like to have walking trails (was previously closed due to Kauri dieback).

Big Bay wetland – on private property – would like to see wetland protected, fenced, planted – need to work with Torpeys (landowner).

Eastern end of Big Bay up path/cliff/cliff top very dangerous, no signage/fencing at top of cliff (logged with report a problem 17/7, LS, 8110603506)

Waiuku Peddlers, Franklin Peddlers – Paul Arthur, do you want a wharf? Manukau Harbour Restoration Society idea (aka Clarks Beach). Matakawau?

Lighthouse is driver of tourism.

Timeline for road repairs....would like to know how long to fix Awhitu Rd slips – scary with trucks, big heavy trucks, school bus.

Need sign to show the lighthouse is closed in Waiuku
