### DIRECTION (19 MAY 2023) FROM THE HEARING PANEL

#### HEARING PANEL'S DIRECTION IN RESPONSE TO THE AUCKLAND COUNCIL'S MEMORANDUM REQUESTING A PAUSE OF ALL HEARINGS AND ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCESSES FOR PC 78

- 1. In accordance with the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) Part 6 Clause 96 of the First Schedule and sections 34 and 34A, the Auckland Council (the Council) has appointed an Independent Hearing Panel (IHP). The IHP has been delegated to hear submissions and make recommendations to the Council on the IPI plan changes and decisions on the non IPI plan changes. Its delegations also include addressing any procedural matters.
- 2. The IHP has received a Memorandum from Auckland Council<sup>1</sup> requesting a pause of all hearings and alternative dispute resolution processes (ADR) for PC 78. The reasons for this were set out in the Memorandum, with the final paragraph stating:

For the reasons set out in this memorandum it is therefore respectfully requested that the IHP pauses the current hearing and alternative dispute resolution / expert conferencing processes for all topics under PC78 for the time-being and counsel is available to attend a conference at short notice to discuss this request. We also respectfully suggest that consideration be given at any conference as to whether there are any PC78 topics that are considered discrete enough to be considered at this time.

- 3. The IHP held a Conference<sup>2</sup> in which the views of the Council<sup>3</sup> and a number of submitters were provided via written statements and presentations. Those views varied from pausing the entire PC 78 hearings and ADR process, continuing with the current hearings and ADR schedule (i.e., not pausing), and partially pausing and continuing with some PC 78 hearings and ADR processes.
- 4. The IHP issued a preliminary Direction<sup>4</sup> on this matter stating<sup>5</sup>:

Given the current uncertainty with respect to the timing and scope of the two proposed variations to be advanced by the Council (as set out in the Council's statement presented

at the Conference), and the range of views as to which topics may or may not be able to proceed prior to the variations being notified, the IHP considers it appropriate <u>to not</u> <u>schedule any PC 78 hearings at this time</u>.

This pause of hearings is an interim position. The IHP is currently working through the complexities of which hearing topics could proceed now to ADR and hearing on the basis that they are discrete enough (i.e., less likely to be significantly impacted by the proposed variations) and be heard prior to the foreshadowed variations being notified and merged with PC 78 (per clause 16B of Schedule 1 to the RMA).

Once it is determined what, if any, hearing topics can proceed the IHP will issue another Direction.

- 5. The preliminary Direction also set out those ADR topics that would continue.
- 6. The IHP has now completed its analysis of all PC 78 topics and the submissions that relate to them in order to determine which hearings are reasonably able to continue without significant risk of 're-work' being needed next year once the Council's proposed variations are notified and hearings are able to resume. In completing this analysis, the IHP has been mindful of the statutory duties in ss 18A and 21 of the RMA, as well as ensuring the hearing process is fair to all parties, including by avoiding duplication of hearings and the imposition of additional costs on parties that such duplication would bring. The IHP considers that the hearing schedule it has determined for the remainder of 2023 strikes the appropriate balance between those competing considerations.
- 7. The hearings that the IHP directs shall proceed this year are set out in the attached table. A hearings schedule (and any additional ADR) will be completed as soon as possible and provided to all parties.
- 8. The following scheduled ADR will continue, but with all other ADR postponed at this time until advised otherwise.
  - 010J Māori Cultural Heritage Pukekiwiriki Pā and Pararēkau Island (second session requested by the parties).
  - 016A City Centre Zone Provisions (but not 014D Height City Centre WC Intensification response).
  - 020A 1201 Britomart Precinct.
  - 020G-1211 Viaduct Precinct.
  - 020I- 1214 Wynyard Precinct.
  - 20AL 1540 Takapuna Precinct.

- 9. In addition to the above the IHP directs the Council to report back to the IHP no later than **4 July 2023** on the following:
  - the progress in establishing and agreeing the scope of the two variations<sup>6</sup>;
  - the work it has already undertaken on the variations;
  - the work still to be completed on the variations and its timeframe; and
  - the likely notification dates of the variations.
- 10. In light of the information to be provided above, the IHP also seeks Council's view (at the time the information is provided) as to what other hearings (not already identified in the attached table) could be heard in 2023 on the basis that that hearing topic would not be impacted by the scope of the proposed variations.
- 11. The IHP will continually seek updates from the Council regarding progress in advancing the variations. This is to ensure that the IHP will be able to meet its obligations to hear all submissions and make its recommendations to the Council within the time period set by the Minister for the Environment. If the IHP considers insufficient progress is being made, or the notification of the variations is delayed, the IHP will need to consider scheduling all of the hearings that are currently adjourned.
- 12. To avoid any doubt, this Direction does not affect PCs 79 and 80 which are yet to be heard.
