Auckland has the largest population of people aged 65 and older in New Zealand, living in different local board areas.

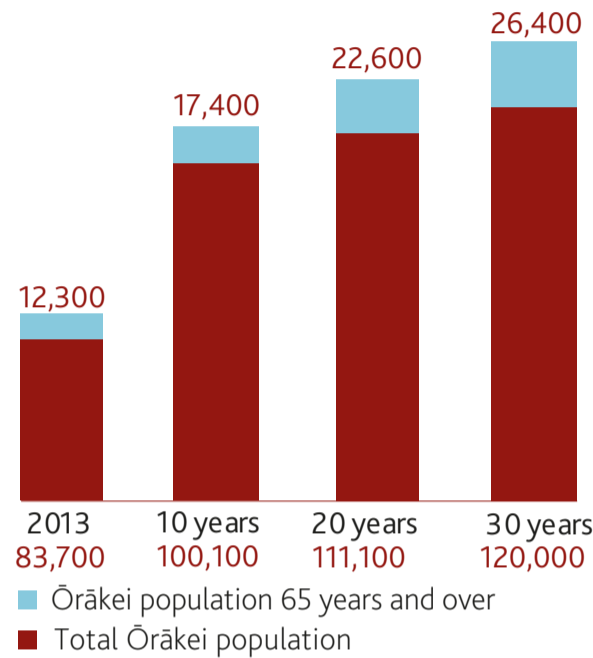
Auckland's older population is not a homogenous group. Differences include:

- financial independence.

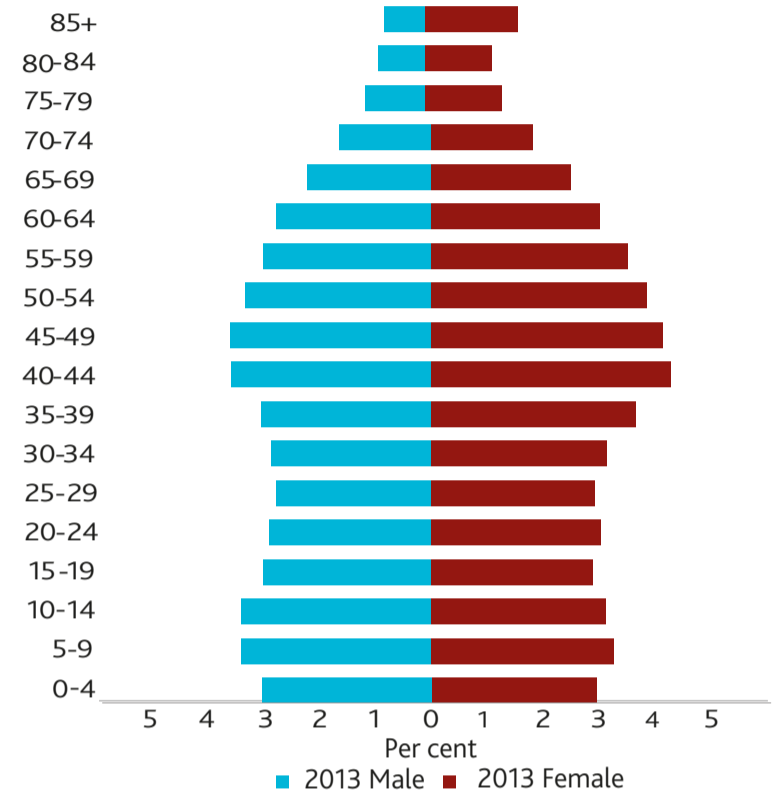
These differences affect how older people contribute and participate in their local area and wider community.

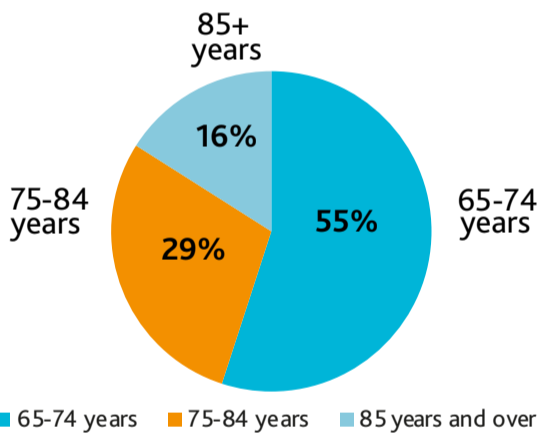
of the population of Ōrākei was over 65 years of age in 2013 growing to **17%** in the next 30 years

### ETHNIC COMPOSITION OF OLDER RESIDENTS

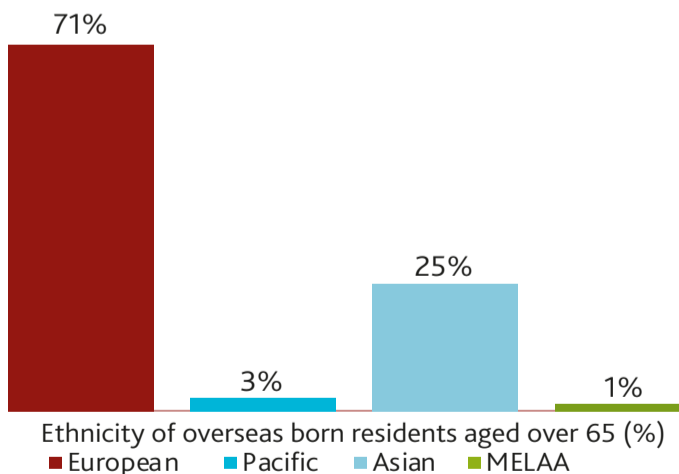

### HOME OWNERSHIP



**73%** of older Ōrākei residents own or partly own their residence

### EMPLOYMENT

**27%** of older residents are in full time or part time paid employment



### MEDIAN PERSONAL INCOME

**\$31,600** this is higher than all older Aucklanders
