General codes and conditions for all facilities

Definitions

Council - means Te Kaunihera o Tāmaki Makaurau, Auckland Council.

Ranger – means a council park ranger or other authorised representative acting on behalf of a park ranger.

Booking – the ‘Controlled Use Permit’ giving permission from council to the booking organiser to use and or stay at a regional park accommodation or bookable facility.

Booking organiser – the person named on the booking for the facility / the booking or group organiser / the hirer.

Facility – means campground, certified self-contained parking area, bach, lodge, bookable site or overnight vehicle parking.

Legislation compliance

By accepting these codes and conditions the booking organiser enters into an agreement with council.

By entering into this agreement, the booking organiser warrants and confirms to comply with all legislation, statutory rules, regulations and bylaws in force and as updated from time to time. It is recommended the booking organiser is familiar, where relevant, with the current versions of:

Decisions on how to comply with legislative requirements are for the booking organiser, however, where applicable the booking organiser must comply with any policies or requirements of council in relation to legislative requirements.

The booking organiser understands and accepts that council may immediately terminate this agreement if the booking organiser or a member of their group breaches any legislative requirements.

Booking

Bookings are made online or at a Council service centre. Cash is not accepted for payments and cannot be accepted by rangers at the facility.

The facility can only be used for the purpose designated in the booking. It is not able to be used for other activities, or to gain access to facilities or other park areas for other purposes.

The booking is non-transferable to another party or person.

A valid booking is required for the full duration and cover all members of the group using the facility.

A booking does not entitle the booking organiser or a group member to conduct any activity for which a 'Discretionary Use Permit' is required such as special or high impact events. More information about Discretionary Use Permit can be found here

The booking organiser must only make bookings for a genuine use. "Ghost" bookings, defined as reserving a facility without the intent to use it or cancelling at short notice to prevent others from booking, are strictly prohibited. Auckland Council reserves the right to monitor usage, cancel suspected ghost bookings, and take further action, including restricting future bookings.

Bookings may be terminated if these codes and conditions are not followed.

Auckland Council is entitled to modify or cancel bookings or allocations at its sole discretion. This may be due to the facility needing to be closed for reasons such as, but not limited to unsuitable ground conditions, damage, maintenance, park operations, events outside of Council's control such as Metservice Orange / Red weather warnings, and multiple active online accounts for booking regional park facilities.

Booking organiser's responsibilities

The booking organiser must keep their online account up to date with current contact information. Each booking organiser is prohibited from holding multiple, active online accounts for booking regional park facilities.

The booking organiser must produce a valid booking on request of a ranger. The booking organiser should be present at the facility for the duration of the booking.

The booking organiser is responsible to ensure all members in their group are informed, aware and meet the booking's codes and conditions and other bylaws and legislation.

The booking organiser is responsible for ensuring any activity undertaken at the facility comply with these codes and conditions and other legislation and bylaws.

The booking organiser is responsible for ensuring suitable supervision is in place for any group members aged of 17 and under.

These 'Codes and Conditions' are subject to change without prior warning. It is the booking organiser's responsibility to be aware of the codes and conditions at the time of their booking of the facility.

Liability

The booking organiser shall reimburse council the full costs, including any associated ranger time, to remedy, restore or replace any part of the facility and or chattels, resulting from any omission, negligence or act of wilful damage by the booking organiser or the members of their group.

Park Rangers

Rangers have the authority to:

- enter a facility during the duration of the booking
- direct group members to specific areas
- request group members to move vehicles
- limit or prohibit vehicle access to an area
- stop inappropriate activities
- terminate the booking, at any time at their sole discretion without a refund

Vehicles

Only persons with the appropriate full or restricted driving licence are allowed to drive vehicles on regional park land.

The speed limit on all park roads is 30km/hr and 10km/hr within the grounds of the facility - for the safety of children, other park users please drive with care.

Vehicles must be parked in authorised areas or as instructed by a ranger.

Vehicles **must** only be to be driven around the park during park opening hours, unless in an emergency or if authorised by a ranger. Opening hours are:

- daylight Saving: 6am - 9pm
- non-daylight Saving: 6am - 7pm

See specific facility sections for requirements on parking and restrictions on number of vehicles a facility can accommodate.

Unfortunately there are currently no charging facilities for electric vehicles at any Regional Park.

It is the driver's responsibility to arrange and pay to be towed out if their vehicle becomes stuck. It is the driver's responsibility to arrange and pay for release if their vehicle has been towed due to blocking emergency access points.

Boats

There are boat ramps at some parks, check the park's website for details of boat launching facilities.

Trailer boats are allowed at some facilities depending on space. See specific facility sections for restrictions on the size and number of trailers a facility can accommodate.

Launching of boats at parks without a boat ramp is restricted to hand carried craft only.

Animals

Certified disability assist dogs which must be accompanying and assisting a person with a disability and wearing its coat, are allowed under control in all parks and at all facilities.

Some parks and facilities allow disability assist dogs in training, which must be accompanying a person genuinely engaged in the dog's training and wearing its coat. See specific facility section.

If staying overnight the dog must be securely tethered or contained within the facility with their coat visible to passers-by while the person they are assisting is sleeping.

All other animals are prohibited from all bookable facilities.

Staying overnight on regional parks

Staying overnight is only allowed at designated areas and people must have a valid booking.

Freedom camping

Freedom camping in regional parks in vehicles is prohibited in accordance with [Te Ture ā-Rohe mō te Puni Mataraharaha ki rō Waka 2022 / Freedom Camping in Vehicles Bylaw 2022](#)

Noise

Please ensure your activities, for example music or ball games, are not heard outside of the booked facility and do not disturb other park users or local residents.

Accommodation facilities have a noise curfew 10pm to 7am.

For any call out from noise control the booking organiser will be held responsible.

Generators are prohibited at all accommodation facilities.

Alcohol

Conspicuous and excessive consumption of alcohol is prohibited - you and your group may be asked to leave the park and or have the booking terminated.

Your event must have appropriate consent from council to comply with the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act.

Drinking and driving / host responsibility: The individual or group utilising a facility must practice 'host responsibility' by providing food and non-alcoholic drinks, and designated drivers and /or alternative transport options.

Smoke free Regional Parks

All parks and bookable facilities are smoke free, this includes the use of e-cigarettes, vapes and heated tobacco products. Council's smokefree policy can be found here

Environment

People must not, disturb, move or remove any naturally occurring thing (soil, rock, shingle, shell, sand, vegetation, material.) from a regional park - this includes digging holes and tying things to native trees (if tying to an exotic tree, padding must be used).

Pest control tools may be located around some facilities. For your safety and effectiveness of the tool please do not touch them and keep children away from them.

Game cameras may also be around some facilities to capture images of pest animals. Any images that capture people but no pests, are deleted. Please do not touch them and keep children away from them.

Safety

The booking organiser must be aware of their responsibility to manage the health and safety of their group members and others as defined in the Health and Safety at Work Act.

If you are entering a remote area, please ensure you are adequately equipped, experienced and aware of potential hazards.

Swim Safe

Enjoying the beach and rivers should be both safe and fun, especially if you follow a few basic safety tips.

- Never swim alone.
- Children must always swim under adult supervision.
- If in doubt stay out, know your limits.
- Read and obey the safety signs.
- Learn to recognise rip currents.
- Always use safety equipment.
- Never swim or surf when tired or cold.
- Consider other users.
- Think about safety first!
- Always supervise children near water.
- On patrolled beaches, swim between the flags.

Check the www.safeswim.org.nz website for up-to-date and forecasted water quality and beach safety information ahead of your visit or event.

Access to Watercare Dams or within 20 metres of the reservoirs high-water mark is prohibited.

Outdoor Safety Code

Remember to be safe in the bush and follow these simple rules.

- Plan your trip – Know your route and/or destination.
- Tell someone - Always tell someone where you are going.
- Be aware of the weather - Don't start your walk too late in the day as it gets dark earlier in the forest because of the dense canopy.
- Know your limits – Know your ability and skills.
- Take sufficient supplies - Carry a track map, warm clothing, food and drink, carry antihistamine as wasps can be a problem in summer/autumn.

Kauri Dieback

All footwear and equipment, such as but not limited to tents, pegs, backpacks, must be clean of all visible soil both prior to entry and exiting a Controlled Area Notice – See specific facility section below for which facilities are in Controlled Area Notice.

Ensure you or your group do not introduce any plant material (including foliage and seeds)

Ensure vehicles and trailers that have travelled in the Waitākere ranges and other known Kauri PTA infected areas are free of dirt including on tyres and undercarriages. Vehicles should be cleaned prior to entry on to park land

Footwear must be cleaned at every hygiene station that you come to.

Further information regarding the disease and measures to be taken is available in online at www.kauri-dieback.co.nz. Should you require further assistance on how to obtain materials for these purposes please call council on 09 301 0101.

Shade tents and marquees

Shade tents (up to 20m²) and marquees (greater than 20m²) are allowed at some facilities. See specific facility section.

The booking organiser must let council know if they wish to have put up a marquee at the facility call council on 09 301 0101 with your booking reference.

The booking organiser must seek approval from council if they wish to have a marquee at the facility. Call council on 09 301 0101 with your booking reference

Shade tents and marquees must be removed from the facility by check out time on day of departure.

Shade tents and marquees must be securely anchored down with weights or pegs.

A ranger must approve the actual location of any shade tents and marquees using pegs greater than 300mm to ensure underground services are not hit or broken.

Marquees must comply with regional parks conditions and have appropriate consents to comply with all council requirements including those for temporary buildings, noise and electrical safety codes.

Consent may be required to comply with temporary building codes, for marquees over 100m². Some hire companies may already have consent. It is the booking organiser's responsibility to ensure any consents are obtained.

Amendments

Booking organisers can make unlimited amendments to their booking free of charge as long as they are completed by midnight two days prior to arrival time. For example, for a booking starting on Friday, the booking organiser has until 24:00 (the end of) Tuesday to cancel their booking.

If amending a booking within the two day time period, a 20% amendment fee will apply to the full value of the booking.

Amendments to dates and or numbers are subject to availability.

Once the start date of the booking has past, the booking can not be amended.

Non-Transferable

Bookings cannot be transferred, resold, or reassigned to any third party. Bookings must be made in the name of the person or organization intending to use the facility.

The booking organiser must not sell, sublet, or otherwise offer the booking to another party, whether for profit or otherwise.

Transferred or resold bookings may be cancelled without refund and the booking organiser may be banned from making future bookings.

The council reserves the right to request proof of identity or organizational affiliation at the time of booking or facility use.

Cancellations

Booking organisers must complete their cancellation by midnight two days prior to the date of arrival and receive a 100% refund. For example, for a booking starting on Friday, the booking organiser has until 23:59 (the end of) Tuesday to cancel their booking.

Cancellation within two days of the arrival date will result in 100% of the booking value being kept by council.

School groups can cancel at any time prior to the date of arrival and receive a 100% refund – Please contact regionalparks@aucklandcouncil.govt.nz for assistance with your cancellation.

Refunds

Refunds will only be paid to the account used to make the booking.

Refunds will be applied as per the amendment and cancellation rules.

There are no refunds for booking made on the same day.

Consideration may be given to refund requests that do not meet the above criteria on a case-by-case basis where the following circumstances exist:

- Where the facility was unavailable, closed or shutdown prior to the booking commencing or during the booking.

- Metservice - Orange / Red Warning has been issued for the facilities location.
- In cases of demonstrated hardship or illness.

In such cases, booking organisers must lodge a request for refund, writing to regionalparks@aucklandcouncil.govt.nz, within five working days of cancelling their booking.

Applications for refunds can only be approved by authorised staff.

Products such as camping passes and vouchers are non-refundable once used. For all other products council will meet its obligations under the relevant acts.

Bonds

Council may require the booking organiser to pay a bond for the use of a facility.

Bonds will be refunded when:

- All conditions of the booking have been met.
- No damage or additional costs have been incurred from conditions not been followed.

Codes and conditions updates

These 'Codes and Conditions' are subject to change without prior warning.

Typically, updates occur annually around March/April.

Baches

General Codes and Conditions for Baches.

Definitions

Bach – accommodation for families and small groups in a traditional kiwi holiday home.

Length of Stay

People can stay a maximum of seven consecutive nights at a bach.

All of the group's belongings must be removed from the facility at the end of the booking.

People under the age of 18

The booking organiser must be 18 years or older. Individuals aged 17 years and under are prohibited from being the booking organiser of a bach.

Guests aged under 18 years are not permitted onsite without adult supervision. A responsible adult (18+) must be present for the duration of the stay.

Arrival / departure form bach

Check in from 2.00pm on the day of arrival.

Check out by 12:00 pm on the day of departure.

Bach access

Access to a bach is for the transport of people and equipment to the facility only. Customers must take the most direct route when entering and exiting the facility. Customers found driving vehicles in prohibited areas of the park can expect their booking to be cancelled for the remainder of their booking and may face further consequences.

For the building access code, call the Council Contact Centre on 09 366 2000, **three to five days** prior to your stay.

Some baches have combination locks on the access gates for your safety and security. Please keep these gates closed and locked at all times.

Online bookings will receive the bach gate code with their booking confirmation if needed.

Overnight camping

Camping (sleeping overnight in tents or CSC vehicles) in the grounds of a bach is prohibited at all times.

Fires and barbecues

All solid fuel, wood and or charcoal fires, barbecues and heaters are prohibited at all baches, irrespective of the main park condition.

Some facilities provide gas barbecues. See the bach's website for more information – see specific bach section for links to the facilities website.

Generators

Generators are prohibited from all baches.

Day visitors

Visiting times are restricted to:

- daylight Saving: 6am - 9pm
- non-daylight Saving: 6am - 7pm

Visitor numbers are restricted. See specific bach section for maximum number of visitors.

Visitor vehicle parking

For safety and to avoid congestion at the bach, the total number of vehicles (booked and visitors) must not exceed the maximum number of vehicles allowed at the bach. See specific bach section.

Additional vehicles must park in the main car park and visitors walk in to see their hosts.

Rubbish free parks

Your facility must be kept clean and tidy during your stay and on your departure.

To help, please take what recycling and rubbish you can home with you.

See specific bach section for what facilities are available.

Capacity

Overnight guests

A maximum of six people are allowed to stay at this bach overnight.

Day visitors

Day visitors are allowed to visit the bach users, but numbers are restricted. The maximum number of people (booked and visitors) is not to exceed 12 people - double the maximum permitted sleeping capacity of the facility.

Access and customer vehicles

The bach is accessible during these times:

- daylight Saving: 6am - 9pm
- non-daylight Saving: 6am - 7pm

A maximum of four vehicles (either the group's or visitor's) are allowed to park at the bach.

Additional vehicles must park in the public car park and occupants walk to the bach.

Always keep the access road clear.

Only park in front of the right hand garage or on the right hand side of the central driveway.

The gate access off Run Road must be closed and always locked.

No vehicle access is allowed for bach users past the bach.

The bach access road has multiple users - other vehicles, walkers, mountain bikers, horse riders, stock:

- when entering an area with sheep grazing, move the sheep away from the gate, open the gate just enough to get the vehicle through and close the gate straight away. This is best done with 2 people. Remember the sheep know that an open gate means new grass on the other side, time to move now.
- do not mob sheep into a corner, please be patient and allow them back past you.
- always shut the gate after you.

Trailers up to 5.5m are allowed. One trailer is considered equivalent to one vehicle.

Water supply

Treated rain water.

Water is precious, so please conserve it.

Shade tents and marquees

Shade tents up to 5m x 5m are allowed.

Marquees are prohibited.

Rubbish, recycling and food waste

Rubbish facilities are located in the bach:

- please put all general rubbish in bags and tie off before putting them in the general rubbish bins.
- please take recycling and what other rubbish you can, home with you.

Dogs

Certified disability assist dogs and disability assist dogs in training are allowed.

All other animals are prohibited.

Horses

Horses are prohibited from the bach gardens at all times.

Horses may be overnighted in the dedicated 'Horse Paddock' near the bach.

All riders must:

- have a network horse riding pass
- follow all regional parks and campground Codes and Conditions
- not block the campground entrance gate or road to other vehicles
- organise temporary fencing, tethering etc for their horse in the holding paddock.

Please remove all horse manure from loading areas.

Stallions/Entires are prohibited.

Horse must be booked at the same time as the camp booking and numbers must not exceed the booked numbers.

The Auckland Council in partnership with the Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary Society Incorporated (TOSSI) and the community are working together to keep Tāwharanui Regional Park an animal and plant pest free environment for resident native species and for the future return of other native animals and plants.

The open sanctuary has a pest proof fence within the park boundary to keep pest animals out. It is an integrated open sanctuary (or mainland island) where public recreation, farming, and conservation of native species are combined.

Please ensure you do the following:

- all visitors must check all vehicles before entering Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary to ensure it is free of pests, vermin and hazardous material.
- all visitors must check all equipment (camping, picnic gear, sports gear, bags etc) for signs of mice, rats or any other pest species prior to entering Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary – be aware of pests entering prepacked equipment that is stored overnight before arriving.
- all animals are prohibited at all times from Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary. This includes dogs and all pets in vehicles (certified disability assists dogs are allowed – see above).
- no plants, soil, hay/straw are allowed to be brought into Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary.

The Auckland Council in partnership with the Shakespeare Open Sanctuary Society Incorporated (SOSSI) and the community are working together to keep Shakespeare Regional Park an animal and pest free environment for resident native species and for the future return of other native animals and plants.

The open sanctuary has a pest proof fence within the park boundary to keep pest animals out. It is an integrated open sanctuary (or mainland island) where public recreation, farming, and conservation of native species are combined.

Please ensure you do the following:

- all visitors must check all vehicles before entering Shakespeare Open Sanctuary to ensure it is free of pests, vermin and hazardous material.

- all visitors must check all equipment (camping, picnic gear, sports gear, bags etc) for signs of mice, rats or any other pest species prior to entering Shakespeare Open Sanctuary – be aware of pests entering prepacked equipment that is stored overnight before arriving.

- all animals are prohibited at all times from Shakespear Open Sanctuary. This includes dogs and all pets in vehicles (certified disability assistance dogs are allowed – see above).
- no plants, soil, hay/straw are allowed to be brought into Shakespear Open Sanctuary.
- all visitors must make sure any gates through the pest proof fence are always closed behind you.
- do not climb the pest proof fence, as this could damage it. Use the pedestrian pest proof fence gates to get through
- alert the park ranger if they see any animal pests.
- please ensure all people involved in your activity to keep away from and not touch any traps or bait stations in the park by keeping to the designated tracks through the sand dunes, plantings and bush areas.
- please ensure all people involved in your activity do not leave any of their rubbish lying around. Remove rubbish from the park, and please help by picking up and removing any rubbish, food, baits they see. Doing this will keep the park clean of rubbish and clear of predators.

People under the age of 18

People aged 17 years and under are prohibited from being the booking organiser of a bookable site. An adult must be the booking organiser.

Site

The maximum group size involved in the event must not exceed the capacity of the site. See specific bookable site section below.

Booking a site does not provide exclusive use of the area of park or facilities – booking a site means there aren't other events booked in the same area on the same day.

The use of a site must not exclude the public from passing by or walking through the site or use of park facilities such as toilet blocks, barbecues, picnic tables or beachfront areas.

Arrival / departure from bookable site

All bookable site bookings are from 6am, irrespective of the planned time of use.

Bookable sites must be occupied by 9am, or they will be made available to other users.

Sites should be vacated by:

- 9pm during daylight Saving
- 7pm during non-daylight Saving

Vehicle access

Some bookable sites provide limited vehicle access and parking. See specific bookable site section below.

Events and activities

All events and their activities must be conducted with due regard to other park users.

Bookable sites are for day use only – staying overnight is prohibited.

Fires and Barbecues

Bouncy castle or other land-borne inflatable devices (bouncy castles)

The booking organiser must seek approval from council if they wish to have a bouncy castle at the bookable site. Call council on 09 301 0101 with your booking reference.

If approved, then 'Silent Run' generators must be used. All other generators are prohibited.

Bouncy Castles must be removed from the facility by check out time on day of departure.

A ranger must approve the actual location of any bouncy castles using pegs greater than 300mm to ensure underground services are not hit or broken.

Bouncy castles must be operated in a way that meet the requirements under the Worksafe NZ regulations under the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 Sections 30 and 36 for inflatable devices <https://www.worksafe.govt.nz/dmsdocument/1975-bulletin-land-borne-inflatable-device-operating-requirements>

Vendors

A maximum of two food vendors are allowed to supply the event participants only.

Payment must be arranged between the vendor and the booking organiser. Payment between event participants and the vendor is prohibited. All reasonably practicable steps must be taken to prohibit the vendor from selling to any person not involved in the event.

Where there is no vehicle access onto the site - all equipment must be carried on and off site by hand.

Food vendors must meet Food Act requirements. It is the booking organiser's responsibility to ensure the vendor is compliant.

The NZDF regularly uses its firing ranges on the seaward side (north and east) of their land. You should not walk around the coast between Pink Beach and Army Bay if NZDF is flying red flags. NZDF signage will also clearly indicate when the firing ranges are in use.

Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary Information

Tāwharanui Regional Park is an Open Sanctuary.

All visitors must understand and comply with this information when visiting Tāwharanui Regional Park.

The Auckland Council in partnership with the Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary Society Incorporated (TOSSI) and the community are working together to keep Tāwharanui Regional Park an animal and plant pest free environment for resident native species and for the future return of other native animals and plants.

The open sanctuary has a pest proof fence within the park boundary to keep pest animals out. It is an integrated open sanctuary (or mainland island) where public recreation, farming, and conservation of native species are combined.

Please ensure you do the following:

- all visitors must check all vehicles before entering Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary to ensure it is free of pests, vermin and hazardous material.
- all visitors must check all equipment (camping, picnic gear, sports gear, bags etc) for signs of mice, rats or any other pest species prior to entering Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary – be aware of pests entering prepacked equipment that is stored overnight before arriving.
- all animals are prohibited at all times from Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary. This includes dogs and all pets in vehicles (certified disability assists dogs are allowed – see above).
- no plants, soil, hay/straw are allowed to be brought into Tāwharanui Open Sanctuary.
- all visitors must make sure any gates through the pest proof fence are always closed behind you.
- do not climb the pest proof fence, as this could damage it. Use the pedestrian pest proof fence gates to get through
- alert the park ranger if they see any animal pests.
- please ensure all people involved in your activity to keep away from and not touch any traps or bait stations in the park by keeping to the designated tracks through the sand dunes, plantings and bush areas.
- please ensure all people involved in your activity do not leave any of their rubbish lying around. Remove rubbish from the park, and please help by picking up and removing any rubbish, food, baits they see. Doing this will keep the park clean of rubbish and clear of predators.

Passes

General Codes and Conditions for Camping Passes

Definitions

Vehicle accessible campground - are accessible by a range of private transport including motor vehicles.

Back Country campground – are reasonably easily accessible by foot, by bicycle, on horse or by watercraft, depending on location.

Facilities

Camping passes can be used for camping at the following facility types:

- Vehicle accessible campground – restrictions on vehicle size and type may apply, see site specific codes and conditions.
- Back country campground

Camping passes cannot be used for:

- Staying at Kaipatiki Reserve or Muriwai Regional Park Campgrounds
- Camping at a Waka/sea kayaking campground
- Staying at a CSC overnight parking area and CSC parking area
- Staying at a bach or lodge
- Booking of a bookable picnic site
- Booking of overnight parking

- Accessing a campground for another purpose – for example but not limited to fishing during the night

Conditions of use

Camping Pass holders must follow all relevant ‘Regional Parks Codes and Conditions for Accommodation and Bookable Facilities’.

Camping passes are not transferrable to another party or person.

Camping passes do not enable the holder to pre-book or guarantee camping space at a campground.

- To book ahead (E.g. for the next day or week), pass holders must follow the public booking system process. Additional days are charged at normal camping rates.

The camping pass holder may not book more than the number of people on the account.

- To book extra people into a campground, pass holders must follow the public booking system process. Additional people are charged at normal camping rates.

Camping passes are valid for 12 months from 1 October to 30 September. The expiry date is stated on the camping pass. The camping pass is an annual pass based on these dates, with no pro-rata deductions for:

- time of year purchased,
- seasonal and or operational closures,
- closures for unforeseen reasons - for example but not limited to: significant weather events / failure of critical infrastructure / an epidemic or a pandemic.

Length of Stay

People can stay a maximum of seven consecutive nights at a campground.

People can stay a maximum of 14 nights in any 28 day period, at a campground in the regional park network.

Cancellation and refunds

Camping passes are non-refundable once used.

Council can cancel a camping pass at any time due to:

- misuse,
- not following a direction of a ranger,
- not following the ‘Regional Parks Codes and Conditions for Accommodation and Bookable Facilities’

No refund shall be offered for cancelled camping passes.
