City Centre zones

Table 8: Performance categories

Category A:	Areas of p <u>Pedestrian areas</u> containing significant formal elements and features intended to encourage longer term recreational or relaxation use, <u>including public open spaces</u> such as major and minor public squares, parks and other open spaces, including Aotea Square, Queen Elizabeth Square, Albert Park, Myers Park, St Patrick's Square, and Freyberg Place.
Category B:	Areas of p <u>Pedestrian use areas</u> containing minor elements and features intended to encourage short term recreation or relaxation, such as minor pedestrian open spaces, pleasance areas in road reserves, <u>and streets with significant groupings of landscaped seating features,</u> including Khartoum Place, <u>Mayoral Drive</u> and <u>pleasance areas,</u> Queen Street.
Category C:	Areas of formed footpath or open space pedestrian <u>linkages,</u> used primarily for pedestrian <u>movement,</u> transit and devoid of significant or repeated recreational or relaxational features, such as footpaths where <u>including footpaths</u> not covered in categories A or B above.
Category D:	Areas of road, carriage way, or vehicular routes, <u>Streets</u> used primarily for <u>vehicular movement</u> transit and open storage, such as <u>streets</u> roads generally where devoid of any features or form which would include the spaces <u>identified</u> in categories A - C above.
Category E:	Represents conditions <u>that</u> which are dangerous to the elderly and infants and of considerable cumulative discomfort to others. Category E conditions are unacceptable and are not allocated to any physically defined areas of the city.
Note: All through-site links and other private land given over to public use as bonus features, or subject to public access easements, must be subject to the wind environmental categories.
