



Devonport Takapuna Local Board Grants Programme 2025/2026

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Our Local Board Grants Programme aims to provide contestable and discretionary community grants to local communities.

Outcomes sought from the local grants programme

Our grants programme will be targeted towards supporting the following outcomes, as outlined in our local board plan:

- Our natural and built spaces are cared for and we put water quality and the environment front and centre
- We value inclusivity, diversity, and resilience
- · Our community has access to quality services in facilities that meet their needs
- Our infrastructure supports growth, and our safe, efficient transport offers diverse travel options
- Our economy is thriving, our town centres are vibrant, and there is opportunity for all

Note: All applicants are expected to outline in their application how their project will contribute to at least one of the outcomes outlined in the **Devonport-Takapuna Local Board Plan 2023**.

Lower priorities

- event management costs and fees for professional and specialised services
- groups and/or activities taking place outside the local board area, unless the applicant can clearly demonstrate the benefit to local board members.
- coaching and training
- applicants who have already had one successful Devonport-Takapuna Local Board contestable grant application in the current financial year
- community events that have commercial sponsorship
- consent and permitting fees

Exclusions

In addition to the eligibility criteria outlined in Auckland Council's overarching Community Grants Policy, the Devonport-Takapuna Local Board will not fund:

- groups which have not completed outstanding accountability obligations by the closing dates of the 2025/2026 Devonport-Takapuna Local Board Grants rounds
- applications for core operational expenses, such as:
 - wages and salaries
 - rent, including rent for storage units

- cleaning expenses
- Utilities, such as power and water
- events which have received regional events funding and therefore primarily benefit the region as opposed to just the local board area
- retrospective costs, unless this is necessary as a condition of the grant, or the local board is satisfied that there are mitigating circumstances
- gifts/prizes, including prizes and trophies for sports events
- initiatives that are eligible and can be funded by central government
- applications towards alcohol or liquor licenses.
- projects and activities in schools and churches unless a plan on how the project will be open to the wider community or benefit to the wider community can be demonstrated.
- travel and accommodation unless there is strong evidence of benefit to the community
- applications that require commitment to ongoing funding or financial support
- catering

Applicants with no formal legal structure

Applicants with no formal legal structure may apply for grants of up to \$1,000 through the local board grants programme; however, the board expects to see evidence from the group indicating community support for the activity and its objectives.

Investment approach

The Devonport-Takapuna Local Board has allocated budgets to support the local grants programme as follows:

- Local Grants
 - Minimum and Maximum amount per grant: \$1,500 to \$10,000

Multi-board Grants

Multi-board grants are cancelled. Any changes to the availability of multi-board grants will be communicated to applicants in advance of the next financial year (starting July 2026).

Accountability measures

The Devonport-Takapuna Local Board requires that all successful applicants provide:

- evidence that the use of the funds matched their application.
- evidence that the project or event has delivered set outcomes/objective
- a completed accountability form within two months of project completion
- the contribution of the local board is acknowledged in all publicity and signage
- · any events funded or partially funded by the local board are to be smoke-free

The Devonport-Takapuna Local Board also encourage successful grant applicants to invite their Local Board members to activities and events if possible.
