Our Local Grants Programme provides a funding source that is aimed at helping local communities to achieve their aspirations. Together we can contribute to making Māngere-Ōtāhuhu a thriving, safe and vibrant community.

Outcomes sought by the Mangere-Ōtāhuhu Local Board

Our grants programme will be targeted towards supporting the following outcomes:

- Young people have opportunities to engage and connect with each other through arts, sports and cultural activities.
- Rangatahi leadership and development opportunities are supported.
- Initiatives that focus on education and employment outcomes are supported, especially for Māori and Pasifika young people.
- A strong local economy.
- M\u00e4ngere-\u00f6t\u00e4huhu is the heart of M\u00e4ori and Pasifika arts and culture.
- Our environment and heritage are protected, enhanced and preserved.
- Our area is well-connected.
- We have a range of facilities to meet diverse needs.
- M\u00e4ngere-\u00f6t\u00e4huhu is a place where communities thrive and belong.

Our priorities sought from grant applications

The Māngere-Ōtāhuhu Local Board particularly welcomes grant applications that align with the following priorities:

- Young people are engaged and have a voice and contribute positively in local matters.
- Training and employment opportunities for the local community are improved, especially for Māori and Pasifika youth.
- Opportunities for Māori and Pasifika arts and cultural expression are increased.
- Opportunities for active living, community involvement and connectedness are increased.

Criteria:

If you are aged between 13 and 24 years old, you can apply for a grant for:

- Learning and development opportunities to build on your own leadership and experience within your community
- Supporting the development of your own social enterprise project
- Support to attend conferences, programmes or training for personal development, such as climate change, leadership, social innovation, wellness, arts and culture, trade, sports, and media.
- Run an event or programme in response to community interest and need.

When you apply for this grant, your project must align with <u>Māngere-Ōtāhuhu Youth</u> Grants outcomes and funding priorities 2021/2022

More about the Mangere-Ōtahuhu Youth Grants

To be eligible for the grant, you must:

- Be aged between 13 and 24
- Live or attend school within the M\u00e4ngere-\u00f6t\u00e4huhu Local Board area
- Be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- Include a letter from your school principal, teacher, tutor, community leader or employer in support of your application.

Types of projects funded by the grant:

- Arts
- Community
- Environment
- Events
- Heritage
- Sports and recreation

Grant value:

\$0 - \$1000

Ineligibility

In addition to the eligibility criteria, the Māngere-Ōtāhuhu Local Board will not fund:

- Unfinished applications
- Applicants who have failed to complete or provide satisfactory accountability reports from previous grants received

Applicants can only apply for the same project or activity once per financial year.

Application dates

Grant rounds for 2021 - 2022 will close on the following dates:

Accountability measures

The Māngere-Ōtāhuhu Local Board requires that all successful applicants:

- Include the M\u00e4ngere-\u00fbt\u00e4huhu local board logo on their publicity and promotional material, with the words "funded by/part funded by M\u00e4ngere-\u00fbt\u00e4huhu Local Board".
- Be available to work with Council staff on media coverage and provide at least one photograph of the event or activity.
