Project Update #11

Great news! Construction work is complete on the first stage of the park, and we're excited to open more areas for the community to enjoy.

The park has a combination of paths, sportsfields, a baseball diamond and large grassed areas that provide opportunities for walking, jogging, sport, and play.

The carpark entrance off Squadron Drive is open, and additional signage has been placed at park entrances.

A new path through the centre of the park provides added connections to Squadron Drive, Clark Road and Joshua Carder Drive.

Toilet facilities are open and changing rooms will be available for use by sports clubs, when the sportsfields open for play later this year.

Sportsfields

Fencing will remain around the two sand carpet sportsfields and the baseball diamond until October, when the sportsfield lighting will be installed and the linemarking of the fields will be completed.

Planting

Over 12,000 new native plants have been planted around the park boundaries along Squadron Drive and Clark Road, and within the overland stormwater drainage swales.

Clark Road park boundary

The park boundary along Clark Road has been sown with grass and topped with straw mulch to help the grass establish.

Construction of the footpath, kerbing and parking bays will be completed as a future stage, when funding is available.

Next steps for the park

Over the coming months, work will focus on:

- completing minor repair works including tidying up cracks in the concrete and installing additional path drainage
- installing sportsfield lighting around the baseball diamond and two sand carpet sportsfields is planned for October.

Future stages

The Upper Harbour Local Board will decide on the priority and timing of future stages of the park which is subject to funding.

The park will continue to be developed in line with the Master Plan for the park.
