WHAT HAPPENS AT A HEARING

Te Reo Māori and Sign Language Interpretation

Any party intending to give evidence in Māori or NZ sign language should advise the hearings advisor at least ten working days before the hearing so a qualified interpreter can be arranged.

Hearing Schedule

If you would like to appear at the hearing please return the appearance form to the hearings advisor by the date requested. A schedule will be prepared approximately one week before the hearing with speaking slots for those who have returned the appearance form. If changes need to be made to the schedule the hearings advisor will advise you of the changes.

Please note: during the course of the hearing changing circumstances may mean the proposed schedule may run ahead or behind time.

Cross Examination

No cross examination is allowed at the hearing. Only the hearing commissioners are able to ask questions. Attendees may suggest questions to the commissioners and they will decide whether or not to ask them.

The Hearing Procedure

The usual hearing procedure is:

- **the chairperson** will introduce the commissioners and will briefly outline the hearing procedure. The Chairperson may then call upon the parties present to introduce themselves. The Chairperson is addressed as Madam Chair or Mr Chairman.
- The **council staff** will be called upon to provide a brief overview of the proposal. The hearing panel may ask questions of the staff.
- The **local board's** have the opportunity to provide comments on Monday, 9 May 2022. These comments do not constitute a submission however the Local Government Act allows the local board to make the interests and preferences of the people in its area known to the hearing panel.
- **Submitters** (for and against the proposal) are then called upon to speak. Submitters speaking time may be restricted, please refer to your hearing notification letter. Submitters' active participation in the hearing process is completed after the presentation of their evidence so ensure you tell the hearing panel everything you want them to know during your presentation time. Submitters may be represented by legal counsel or consultants and may call witnesses on their behalf. The hearing panel may then question each speaker.
 - Late submissions: The council officer's report will identify submissions received outside of the submission period. At the hearing, late submitters may be asked to address the panel on why their submission should be accepted. Late submitters can speak only if the hearing panel accepts the late submission.
 - Should you wish to present written evidence in support of your submission please ensure you provide the number of copies indicated in the notification letter.
- **Council Officers** will then have the opportunity to clarify their position and provide any comments based on what they have heard at the hearing.
- The chairperson will outline the next steps in the process and adjourn or close the hearing.
- If adjourned the hearing panel will decide when they have enough information to make a recommendation and close the hearing. The hearings advisor will contact you once the hearing is closed.
- The hearing panel will now deliberate on what they have heard and read and will make a recommendation to the Parks, Art, Community and Events Committee.

On February 11 2022, Council stated categorically in OurAuckland that Auckland's regional parks will continue to be owned and managed by Auckland Council on behalf of all of the people of Auckland and there are no plans to change this.

The draft Regional Parks Management Plan is currently out for public consultation and I would encourage you to read and submit on it'.

I submit that the assurances given by the Mayor's office were wrong. Aucklanders do indeed, stand in dire risk of losing ownership of and free access to our Regional Parks. And Aucklanders' quality of life in our city is therefore likely to deteriorate.

3. Because Auckland is such a big city, the only city of its size in New Zealand, the preservation of open space is essential to its citizens' wellbeing, now and in the future.

With increasing intensification families are living in developments and apartment complexes without an inch of open space around them. Local parks and playgrounds are therefore of immediate local concern.

The Regional Parks are even more important to Auckland's future. Accumulated since 1940 a network of expansive open space around the city has provided generations with space to walk, breathe fresh air, protect habitats for birds, insects and native fish, hear birdsong, and camp out at modest cost. Large family picnics at the Regional Parks are a joy.

4665

These parks have been paid for by past Councils and Regional Councils. Some have been given to the people of Auckland by generous donors.

The Parks are all maintained and enhanced by ratepayers. Proper care of the network is not cheap. But it has always been acknowledged as a duty to the present and future by governing Councils. When this duty is neglected, the citizens have a triennial opportunity to make their representatives aware of their feelings.

4. The proposal for 'co-governance' sounds benign. (p.41) Yards of verbiage are poured out to that effect.

But while it sounds excellent in words, it has proved malign in practice. We already have experience of co-governance: by the Maunga Authority. In practice, Citizens are divided, by race, into two groups. Pakeha, the majority, comprising all ethnic groups, largely pay for the management of the Maunga, through their rates, while Maori, a minority, led by a chairman from outside Auckland, decide who can use the mountains and how and when. Pleasant trees are removed before their time because they are not 'natives'; pathways are overgrown; the whole ambience is unwelcoming and dangerous. Far fewer Aucklanders enjoy their maunga than did so in the recent past.

'Co-governance' of the kind shown by the Maunga Authority would be disastrous for Auckland's Regional Parks.

Governance by the Council, elected by all the adult citizens is what we have now and we should retain it.

5. A similar proposal is found on p.59 of the Plan. It proposes, benignly, to consider transferring Regional Parks 'that contribute to the coastal area of the Gulf' to the proposed Gulf Forum, which is currently subject to restructuring along the lines described in point 2 above. Almost all the Regional Parks are threatened by this proposal because most have at least one beach. The beaches are a major reason for their value to citizens' recreational needs.

Again, the reasons for the proposal are couched in benign language. Such a transfer to the Forum would improve the level of marine protection. Who opposes marine protection? We all wish the Forum would do a lot more of it. Handing over the Parks would not help.

But handing over the parks would certainly dilute Aucklanders' ability to enjoy and monitor the care of them. Democracy is important. Elected councils are accessible. Elected decision-makers are the CORE of our democracy. Remote, appointed 'Authorities' are not.
