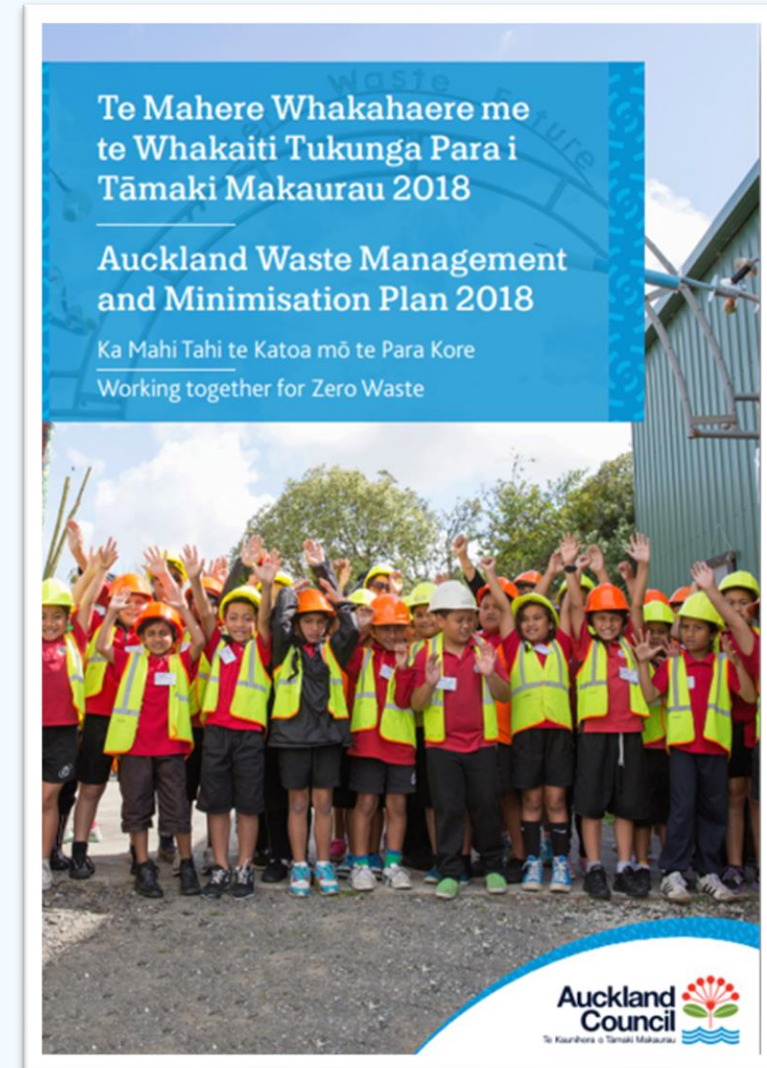

WHAT GOES IN YOUR FOOD SCRAPS BIN

✓ Vegetable scraps, including peelings, stalks and skins	✓ Fruit scraps, including peelings, cores, stalks and skins	✓ Meat scraps
✓ Bread and mouldy food	✓ Pasta and rice	✓ Dairy products
✓ Meat bones and scraps including fat trimmings	✓ Fish scraps and bones and shellfish shells	✓ Eggshells
✓ Paper towels and tissues	✓ Coffee grounds, tea leaves and tea bags	✓ Indoor cut flowers

DO NOT PUT IN:

- ✗ Garden waste
- ✗ Disposable food containers and utensils, including compostable items
- ✗ Plastic bags
- ✗ Cigarette butts
- ✗ Sanitary products and nappies
- ✗ Pet waste
- ✗ Cling film, waxed paper

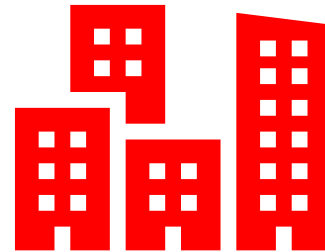

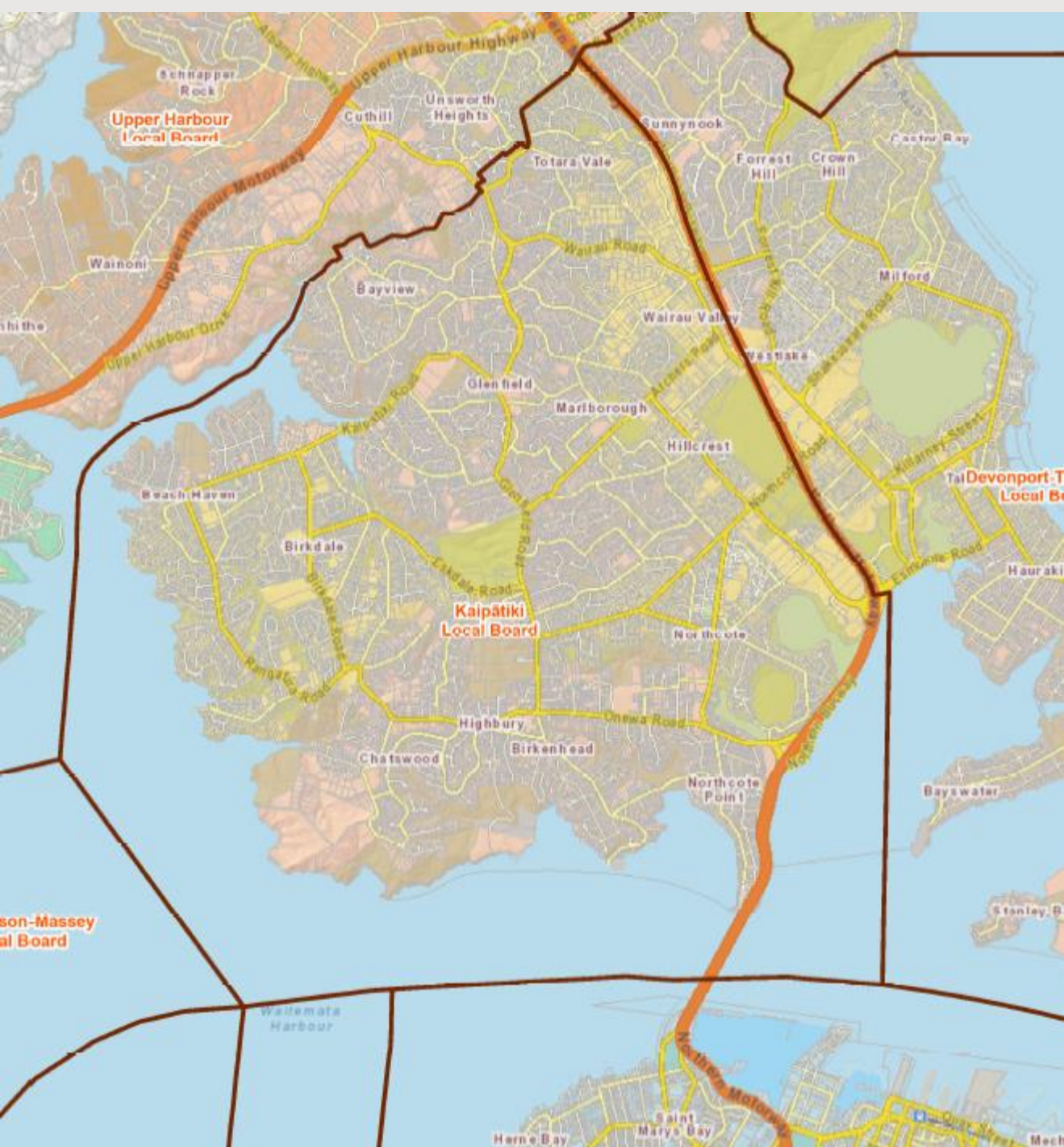
