Birkdale Hall and Kauri Kids rebuild – Concept design

Purpose

To seek feedback on the concept design and the intended community consultation prior to the board's formal approval.





Project background

That the Kaipātiki Local Board:

- a) approve option 1 to rebuild Birkdale community hall and early learning centre (Kauri Kids) at 134 and 136 Birkdale as one multi-purpose building, with a cost estimate of \$2,792,508.
- b) request that the potential user conflict issues identified for option 1, such as noise, be minimised through design.
- c) request that all trees are retained, repurposed or transplanted within the site, where possible.
- d) note that the estimated completion timeframe for option 1 is by the end of financial year 2024/2025.
- e) request that the design incorporates both heritage and Māori design elements.
- f) request that the Chairperson or delegate attends stakeholder meetings.
- g) request that all construction material for this site be repurposed as part of a waste minimisation plan.

Since this resolution, Te Kawerau a Maki have registered their interest to co-design the new building to ensure it includes Te ao Māori design elements and reflects their connection to the whenua.

















GROUND FLOOR PLAN - 1:200 SCALE @ A3






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
3D VIEW - FLOOR PLAN - OVERALL

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









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
3D VIEW - SITE PLAN






FLOOR PLAN - DAYCARE






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






ELEVATIONS - FRONT OF HALL

Cost Estimate is based on TOA Concept Design.

Significant contingencies/ design contingency/ construction contingency have been added. Given the current market situation price escalations have been included in the estimation of the total build with a estimated contract start in Quarter 3 and construction escalation into 2024.





Cost Estimate

The CAPEX renewal budget allocation as approved in June 2022 serves for the continuation of the project.

The current cost estimate is based on TOA concept design.

The cost estimates includes a total of \$1,521,100.00 in design contingencies and possible market inflation/ price escalations over the course of 2022 to 2023/2024 as the estimated construction phase.

The developed design process will enable more accurate cost estimation prior to formal approval of the design.

As the design proceeds into developed design there is opportunity for input through the Project Control Group/ Design Team to discuss design elements and further define the design.



Feedback - Local Board Workshop May 2022

Design Feedback:

- Open Space Usability of open green space Northwest at the 'back' of the building
- Visibility towards the open green space/ General CPTED
- Landscaping to be considered as part of the building design
 - Conceptual landscape design can be included in next design stage
 - > Landscape design to show usability of available space and integration/ flow with building
 - CPTED consideration have been included in design/ Safety in Design workshops in progress
- Externally opened facilities possible concern for 'undesirables'/ CPTED
 - Review design options of atrium as part of the developed design stage Close in atrium or enable access to toilets from within the facility
- Size comparison between new and old facilities (m2)

Requirements Feedback:

- Kauri Kids: Requirement/ Need for under two area
 - Inclusion based on Kauri Kids/ Stakeholder input
 - The under two area is a small section of the overall layout currently at 10m2 which enables multiple uses.

 - Possible review to be discussed as part of next steps.






Proposed Timeline


Birkenhead Heritage Trail project proposal
