Open discussion: Key Moves

Growth – responding to residential intensification and the changing demographics

Connections – improving and developing the network of both physical and cultural connections across

Sustainability – managing parks so that biodiversity of open space contributes to a sustainable, green Auckland

Accessibility – ensuring that the parks and open space network is accessible and encourages social interaction

	Encourage and support the provision of high-quality, distinctive and integrated public art in our built environment, providing an opportunity for storytelling around the Kaipātiki open space network	Preserve the ecological quality of parks and open spaces at its current state and where possible, improve it	Increase socialisation opportunities in parks and open spaces through walkways and connections that are suitable for different accessibility needs.

Prioritisation principles

The following list of principles will be considered when prioritising actions:

- existing capital works programmes and contractual commitments
- areas zoned for high growth (metropolitan centre, town centres, local centres, mixed use, terrace housing and apartments) and where there is a gap in provision identified
- areas of deficiency and/or poor-quality open space prioritised over areas of good provision and/or good quality open space
- alternative options that still deliver high benefits for the community
- planning and funding cycles and other influences such as land acquisitions, large infrastructure projects, integrated planning with neighbouring local boards and other stakeholders.
